PARKING ACCOMMODATIONS

Parking is available at Smith-Hammond-Middleton (SHM) Memorial Gym. When facing SHM, parking is available on the left and behind the building. SHM is the large white building on **Buckley Street** at the eastern edge (back) of the campus, and in the vicinity of the Oliver C. Dawson (football) Stadium. Buckley Street is accessible from Highway 601 (Magnolia St.) and Highway 33 (Russell Street).

From the front (western) entrance of the Campus, follow the main street, bearing left at the fork and proceed to the flashing light. Make a left and the white building to your immediate right is SHM. On this route, you will pass the Kirkland W. Green Student Center on your right. **Parking is non-existent in this area.** The walking distance between SHM and the Student Center is 4/10 of a mile. The Fine Arts Building is across from SHM.

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

This year's theme is "Transforming At-Risk Students Through Multi-Systemic Networking". The conference will highlight Multisystemic Therapy (MST), a family-and home-based treatment that strives to change how youth function in their natural settings – home, school, and neighborhood – in ways that promote positive social behavior while decreasing antisocial behavior. This "multisystemic" approach views individuals as being surrounded by a network of interconnected systems that encompass individual, family, and extra familial (peer, school, neighborhood) factors and recognized that intervention often is necessary in a combination of these systems. Based on the philosophy that the most effective and ethical route to help children and youth is through helping their families, MST views parents(s) or guardian(s) as valuable resources, even when they have serious and multiple needs of their own. Research has shown that this approach is effective with youth (and their families) of different ages, socioeconomic status, and cultural backgrounds. ABOUT THE PRESENTERS

Keynote Speaker: Ms. Michelle A. Dean, LPC/S, CRCC, is currently the Manager of Network Partners at MST Services in Charleston, South Carolina. Her primary duties are to help disseminate MST with a high degree of fidelity in the states of South Carolina, Connecticut, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, Oklahoma, and Texas. Ms. Dean coaches and trains the MST Experts and Program Directors that implement MST for 68 teams around the world. Previously, she served as Associate Professor for the Medical University of South Carolina through the Family Services Research Center.
