

ABOUT SC STATE CAREER CENTER:

This past academic year was met with many challenges due to economic uncertainties, budget shortfalls, and high unemployment. Since 2007 the Career Center has registered over 1,600 students with more than 300 students receiving job offers. From April 1, 2010 to May 7, 2010, sixty to one hundred students received internships, co-op, part-time and permanent job offers. The Savannah River Site was the top employer with a placement of 17 students (interns) and a donation of 100k. Bi-Lo placed 8 students (Co-Op) and donated 4k. Students were also placed at BMW, Kraft, Okonite, Oregon DOT, ADP, Duke Energy, Coca Cola, FBI and various Schools Systems through out the east coast. Also four students received the Daisey D. Johnson book scholarship.

Career Center Highlights

- **More than sixty** students received job offers from April 1, 2010 to May 7, 2010.
- **Eight students** received Co-Op/ Internships with **BI-LO Inc.**
- **Seventeen students** received Co-Op/Internships and Permanent placement at the **Savannah River Site.**
- **Twenty students** received job offers for summer employment at the **Clemson Summer Youth Institute.**

- **Four students** awarded the Daisy Dunn Johnson Scholarship in the amount of \$500- (Mrs. Daisy Dunn Johnson was the first Director of the Career Center).
- **Online Registration-** more than **1,600 students** have registered with the Career Center since 2007.
