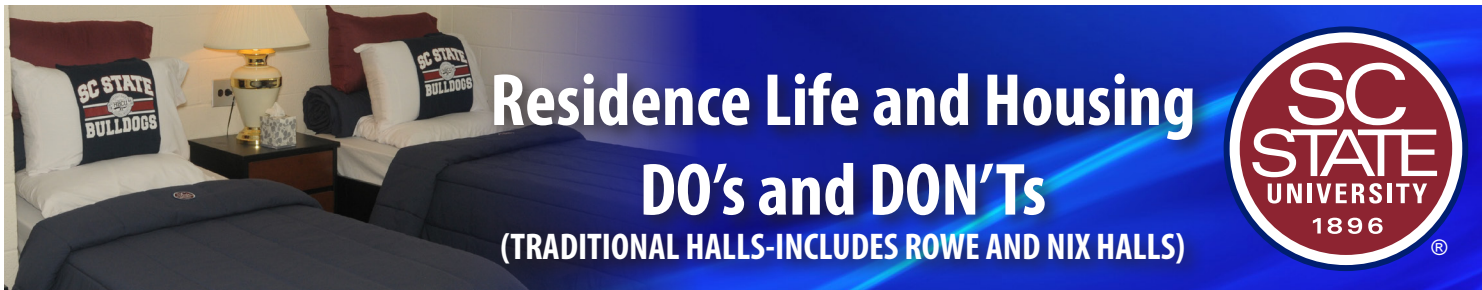

1. You must have a current SC State ID Card before going to your Residence Hall. Now that you are a SC State Bulldog, you are required to carry your ID card with you at all times.
2. When you arrive at your assigned Residence Hall, you must adhere to the "unloading zone" time limit.
3. You will receive a "parking time card" for the 20 minute unloading zone that must be adhered to.
4. Buggies are available for 20 minute checkout with the proper form of ID. You may retrieve your ID upon return of the buggy.
5. After completing the check in process, you will receive an "elevator usage card" with your elevator access time. Please be present when your number is called.
6. Host and hostess will be available on the floors to assist you with unloading at the elevators.
7. Please remember to complete a "Room Inspection Form" and return it to the main office in your Residence Hall.
8. Please ensure that your belongings are within your personal area. Please be respectful of your roommate's space.

DO's

- Keep your room clean
- Visiting hours: 12:00 p.m. - 9:45 p.m.
- Quiet hours: 10:00 p.m. - 10:00 a.m.
- **You MUST have your ID at all times to enter your building**
- Visitation: Only one guest per resident
- Females: No Male overnight guest
- Males: No female overnight guest

DON'Ts:

This is a **Smoke/Tobacco Free Campus**: No cigarette smoking, no cigar smoking, no pipe smoking, no hookah's, no chewing tobacco, no marijuana.

Weapon/Firearm Free Campus: A weapon refers to any object or substance designed or used to inflict a wound, cause injury, or incapacitate, including but not limited to, all firearms, pellet guns, BB guns, bludgeons, metal knuckles, mace, pepper spray, tasers, switchblades, knives, razors and knives designed for offense or defense. Any student found with a weapon will be subject to summary suspension, expulsion from the University, and/or criminal prosecution.

Drug Free Campus: Possession with the intent to Distribute Drugs on campus is a serious violation. Any student found in possession of drugs with the intent to distribute will be subject to expulsion from the University, and/or criminal prosecution.

DON'T's

- Do not smoke in the Residence Halls or on campus
- Do not burn candles or incense
- Do not bring or use weapons, tobacco or firearms in the Residence Halls or campus
- Do not bring cooking appliances
- Do not bunk in the Residence Halls
- Do not wear hats (males) in the Residence Halls or buildings
- Do not consume alcohol if under age
- Do not have parties in the Residence Halls;
- Do not bring pets in the Residence Halls or any other

building

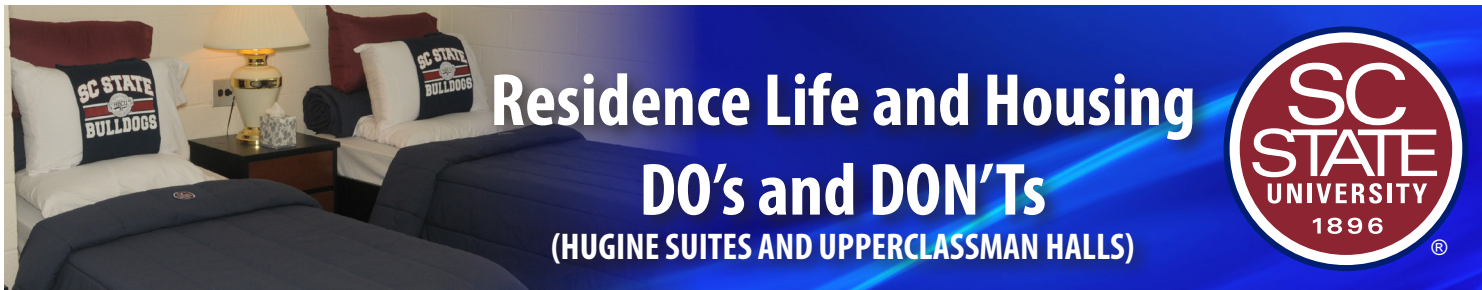
- Do not bring hot plates in Residence Halls or campus
- Do not wear sagging pants
- Do not use profanity
- Do not throw or place your garbage/trash outside the window, breezeway, hallways or stairways
- Do not horse play in the Residence Halls; unnecessary roughness will not be permitted
- Do not put food in the bathroom sinks or in the water fountains
- Do not cut hair in shower (may cause clogging)
- Do not leave hair in the sinks or in the showers
- Do not leave toothpaste in/on the sinks
- Do not touch the fire extinguishers
- Do not touch the fire alarm (unless there is a fire)
- Do not write on the walls, no graffiti, or sticky objects that can remove paint from the wall.

DO's and DON'Ts

(HUGINE SUITES AND UPPERCLASSMAN HALLS)



DO's

- Keep your room clean
- You can have a George Foreman Grill, toaster, coffee maker and blender
- **You MUST have your ID at all times**
- Visitation: Only two guests per resident
- All overnight guests must register at the front office, if not, it will be considered as bunking and you will be fined.

DON'Ts:

This is a **Smoke/Tobacco Free Campus**: No cigarette smoking, no cigar smoking, no pipe smoking, no hookah's, no chewing tobacco, no marijuana.

Weapon/Firearm Free Campus: A weapon refers to any object or substance designed or used to inflict a wound, cause injury, or incapacitate, including but not limited to, all firearms, pellet guns, BB guns, bludgeons, metal knuckles, mace, pepper spray, tasers, switchblades, knives, razors and knives designed for offense or defense. Any student found with a weapon will be subject to summary suspension, expulsion from the University, and/or criminal prosecution.

Drug Free Campus: Possession with the intent to Distribute Drugs on campus is a serious violation. Any student found in possession of drugs with the intent to distribute will be subject to expulsion from the University, and/or criminal prosecution.

DON'T's

- Do not bring cooking appliances
- Do not bunk in the Residence Halls

- Do not bring pets in the Residence Halls or any other

building

- Do not bring hot plates in Residence Halls or campus
- Do not wear sagging pants

- Do not throw or place your garbage/trash outside the window, breezeway, hallways or stairways
- Do not horse play in the Residence Halls; unnecessary roughness will not be permitted
- Do not put food in the bathroom sinks or in the water fountains
- Do not cut hair in shower (may cause clogging)
- Do not leave hair in the sinks or in the showers
- Do not leave toothpaste in/or on the sinks
- Do not touch the fire extinguishers
- Do not touch the fire alarm (unless there is a fire)
- Do not write on the walls, no graffiti, or sticky objects that can remove paint from the wall.

What is e2Campus?

e2Campus is an emergency notification system used to alert SC State University students, faculty and staff of emergencies, closings due to weather-related incidents and other crises threatening the campus. Notifications can be sent to a registered cell phone as a text message or as an electronic communication to an email address. Registering for the service is free; however, standard messaging data rates may apply for subscribed cell phone.
